Remote Learning

We are very proud of how the children have already engaged with Google classrooms. Reading!

Learning to read is the most important skill a child learns at school as it is a gateway to all aspects of the curriculum. Thank you for the support you give your child at home on their reading journey. An important part of early reading is developing fluency. To ensure children enjoy reading and build confidence as they move through the school reading scheme, children are expected to read books that are fully decodable. Pupils are provided with challenge in their reading through texts they experience in the classroom and in guided reading sessions when they are taught particular reading skills appropriate to their age and development. We know that our recently purchased books, across the school, will support this. Please encourage your children to **enjoy, cherish and respect** this valuable resource. We hope to add some further classic titles, titles which reflect diversity and a number of new fiction and non-fiction texts in the coming weeks, which we hope will inspire readers at all levels.

Primary Admissions 2021

Online applications can be made on www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/admissions .

The application process for <u>Primary</u> admissions for children born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 opened on Monday 2 November 2020 with the closing date deadline of 15 January 2021.

Attendance

We know that it is often confusing to separate Covid symptoms from common colds and winter illnesses. Whilst some schools are not accepting children in school with any symptoms of any illnesses, we feel that is important that children attend school regularly and wherever possible. If your child demonstrates any of the Covid 19 symptoms, please DO NOT SEND THEM TO SCHOOL. Please follow the steps in the guidance we have previously released.

We will continue to ask parents to keep their child at home for a period of 48 hours following a bought of diarrhoea or vomiting commencing from the last episode of illness.

We will continue to contact you if your child becomes unwell at school and needs to be collected to go home. This will include when we feel a child may be demonstrating Covid 19 symptoms. In this case, we will ask for you to arrange for your child to be tested and not return to school until we have confirmation of negative test or your child has self-isolated for 10 days from the onset of symptoms. If your child is generally unwell, please also consider if it is in their best interest to be at school. Please contact the school office if your child will be absent from school for any reason.

Pupil Premium Funding and Free School Meals

You may have been aware of the campaign around free school meals over the half term holiday and how we can support vulnerable families in school holidays. Child poverty and hunger is an important ongoing issue and we all want to be sure children do not go without food during their time away from school.

Although the scheme to support families wasn't extended this Autumn half-term, there is help available for low income families at any time; we are able to make referrals for families that we are aware of and also guide families towards organisations which can support.

Since the introduction of Universal Infant Free School Meals for Key Stage 1 pupils, there has been a significant reduction in the number of families applying for Pupil Premium/Free School Meals funding. If you have a child who has moved into Year 3, school meals are now chargeable. As a school we also benefit financially from funding for Pupil Premium pupils so even if your child is in Key Stage 1 we would encourage you to apply. Not only will the school receive additional funds, it also saves you having to remember to apply when your child moves into Year 3. Schools across the country are reporting an increase in Free School Meal applications due to the effects of lockdown and subsequent job losses and reduced hours. If your circumstances have changed and you would like help in applying for Free School Meals, please speak to Mrs Fenner, Miss Pidgeon or Mrs Hibon or Mrs Butler in the school office in strictest confidence. We would also like to reassure parents that Free School Meals information is dealt with sensitively and on a need to know basis.
