All children can enter the classroom as they arrive through the main gate. Children will have an early morning activity ready for them as they prepare for the school day. All children will leave school at 3.15pm. Please ensure children arrive on time and the office is informed of any absence by 9am.

PE Days

Reading

Homework

Homework will be set every Friday, and should be returned to school by the following Tuesday. Children are encouraged to complete as much as they can in a reasonable amount of time for your child.

Homework will focus on the learning completed in school that week, to consolidate what has been taught in English, Maths and the foundation subjects. Children in KS1 will be set weekly spellings to support vocabulary building.

Reading continues to be a high priority for Reception, but this term there will also be a greater focus on writing basic sentences and sounding out simple words with the sounds learned in school.

Drama

This term, we are excited to take part in weekly drama sessions with Valerie from lckle Drama. The lessons will support children develop important oracy skills and become confident presenting to an audience. This will be a great way for the children to explore their expressive side!



English

We will be reading the book 15 Things Not To Do With A Puppy by M.I.McAllister. From this we will be writing reports and instructions. In Reception, children will develop sentence skills by reading this story.

We will also be writing a report, so will be covering a wide range of writing genres. What other texts this term? Check this for sense



Reception: Children will continue to recognise numbers to 10, with the introduction of the concept of zero. We will be using lots of songs and stories to explore this further. **KS1**: Children will secure their understanding of place value, and counting up to 20 and 100. Children will also be learning about height, length and mass. Year 2 will be building upon their knowledge of multiplication and learning about division as the inverse.

Science

Our topic for this term will be Everyday Materials. We will be exploring the different types of materials, and investigating their different properties and purposes.

Innovation

We will continue to think about safe practices online and make animated storybooks.

Humanities

As historians, we will be learning about the Great Fire of London. We will look at the timeline of events, and the subsequent changes made to different aspects of life as a result of this event.
