

## Headteacher's message

After a lovely first week back, we were faced with the tragic news of our beloved Queen passing. Death can be difficult for children to process, and I am sure you will be contending with questions from your children about her death and life. We held a memorial assembly today to mark the life of such a kind and prominent figure, and have given children opportunities to reflect through the planned classroom activities. I know you will join me in wishing her family our condolences. What a very sad loss to the world.

This week, the children have been learning all about routines and expectations ready for the year ahead. They have been getting to know each other in class and have completed some lovely activities that will be displayed around the school, such as self-portraits.

From next week, we ask that children are dropped off at the gates in the mornings. Gates will open at 8:45 and will close at 8:55. Registers are now taken electronically and close at 9:00 in classes, after which point children will be marked late for school.
