

# Headteacher's message

Welcome back! I hope you had a lovely half term full of Autumnal fun. This week, despite the rain, we have had lots to celebrate at school. On Monday, the teachers and I met to discuss ways we can encourage our wonderful learners to be more active. Alongside our resilience project, we are working on our pupils having more of a voice in their lessons. This will include "oral rehearsal" in maths and greater use of partner talk amongst other strategies. We have also made adaptations to our reading lessons. Children in key stage two will have an echo reading session every week as well as reciprocal reading and will have time for independent reading and quizzing. This should ensure they spend more of their lessons focused on reading skills whilst also giving staff time to hear individual readers.

Thank you to the parents who completed the survey last half term. As a result of this helpful feedback, I have added links to our social media and a gallery sharing our practice to our school website. What a fantastic idea – thank you for sharing! We will give further opportunities for feedback later in the year.

Today we had a visit from our chair of governors, Mark Hall. During his visit, Mark noted that there was a positive atmosphere in the school and that staff appear settled.

I am pleased to be able to share that I have successfully appointed maternity cover for Acorn class from the middle of December. Two teachers will share the role – we welcome Mrs Charlotte Foot (our Nature Explorers teacher) to join us Monday-Wednesday and Mrs Claire Simpson (who has been working as a TA) will be the class teacher on Thursdays and Fridays. Both are busy planning and liaising with Miss Murray to make the transition as smooth as possible for the children.
