Headteacher's message

What a chilly week we've had at Hexton this week! The children have enjoyed exploring the ice and some even made tiny ice snowmen during play times!

This week in Monday's assembly, we continued our learning about Advent. Each week we will learn about 2 countries. This week it was Malta and Norway. In Malta, we learnt that a child, normally aged 7-10, does the sermon at the midnight mass instead of the priest! 'The Preaching of the Child' or 'Priedka tat-Tifel' is an old and popular tradition that has taken place in churches since 1883. In Norway, people put out a bowl of rice pudding for the barn elf. If they do not, he may consider that he is not well enough looked after and play tricks on them! The Norwegian Christmas lunch is a rib of lamb followed by rice pudding. Children count down to Christmas using an orange with cloves stuck into it – they remove a clove every day and when the last one is removed it's Christmas!

The panto on Tuesday was a great success. Children and staff alike came back saying how great it was and how funny the actors were.

This week in Acorn class, children have enjoyed Christmas/Winter-themed busy fingers activities such as Christmas tree needle ice, pom pom tweezer painting and exploring winter flora. In Oak class, during art, children were given freedom to make what they wanted. Mrs Calvert said how creative they were and able to solve problems. They made lanterns, magazines and lots of other paper crafts.

This week I went to see years three and four in their learning. Pupils were very able to say what helps them in their maths e.g. manipulatives such as bead strings or drawing pictures to represent their maths. Attitudes to maths are very positive. We are currently developing ways to teach all three year groups concurrently in more manageable ways.
