This week was short but busy at school. Tuesday's gardening club created a wonderful den that all children have enjoyed for the rest of the week. On Wednesday, children enjoyed Coronation crafts in anticipation of the Coronation tomorrow. On Thursday our HIP joined us to highlight strengths and next steps in school practice. We agreed that there are many strengths to the curriculum offer at Hexton, such as creative teaching and learning opportunities. For example, we saw a lovely lesson on fractions in KS1 using sweets, KS2's work on Skara Brae involves looking at farming videos and analysing brochures for Cheddar Gorge and other places of interest and EYFS followed up their work on doubling and sharing by having a role play picnic outside during active learning. Our next steps are to further develop pupil's responses to marking and to ensure that interactions between staff and pupils support their understanding and enable strong progress.

The children have created some bunting and baked some cakes ready for this afternoon's party on top of their usual curriculum lessons. This afternoon, all children will be off timetable to enjoy the party – we do hope lots of you are able to join us for a picnic and crafts.
