<p>In music, pupils learn to listen carefully, fine tuning their auditory skills and developing their ability to evaluate and appraise.</p>	<p>Music increases pupils' confidence through self-expression and performance, as well as providing a sense of achievement.</p>	<p>Music provides pupils with a range of vocabulary to describe the features of different musical styles and genres and articulate their responses to these.</p>
<p>Music encourages teamwork, helping build relationships by providing pupils with shared experiences.</p>	<p>Pupils demonstrate perseverance, persistence and discipline as they develop their musical skills.</p>	<p>Music helps pupils to appreciate and understand a wide range of traditions and cultures.</p>
<p>Pupils learn how music is created, produced and communicated, through the elements e.g. pitch, timbre.</p>	<p>Music provides pupils with the opportunity to use technology appropriately, to enhance and communicate their own compositions and performances.</p>	<p>Having the opportunity to play musical instruments helps pupils to develop self-discipline and improve memory.</p>
